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In the early history of the United States, codes were widely used, as were book ciphers. Book ciphers approximate onetime keys if the book used is lost or unknown. (A famous unsolved book cipher is the Beale cipher (c. 1820), which purports to give the location of a buried treasure in Bedford County, Virginia.)
