Four Pillars of Education. UNESCO is the UN agency that deals with education. It regularly held a special meeting with the nine countries (called E-nine) of its members: Bangladesh, Brazil, China, India, Indonesia, Egypt, Mexico, Nigeria and Pakistan. One of the most important outcome of the meeting held in Jomtien (Thailand) to produce the declaration of “Education for All” which means education for all, identified four pillars as the foundations of renewal and reform of education.
